About RNLK College

Raja Narendra Lal Khan Women's College (Autonomous), popularly known as 'Gope College', began its significant odyssey in women's education on 22nd August 1957. It has maintained this zeal and is the first and only women's college in West Bengal receiving the prestigious Autonomous status by UGC from 2018. The College has earned numerous accolades from various academic bodies [the State Higher Education Department, UGC CPE-II, DST FIST I & DBT-STAR, PG Curie and MHRD, Govt. of India]. The undying dedication of all staff, faculty and students has helped the College maintain its NAAC 'A' Grade in all 3 cycles. We are immense proud that our college ranked amongst the top 150 colleges in the country as per NIRF-2021 rankings. 28 UG and 14 PG departments and 2 Research Centers [Humanities and Social Sciences and in Natural and Applied Sciences] have been

established at the College [affiliated to Vidyasagar University]. The College has an active Career Advancement Centre, which offers value added courses and arranges regular campus interviews by various renowned companies. The college campus has ICT and Smart Classrooms in each Department, Wi-Fi facility in campus, modernized laboratories in Science departments, multimedia language laboratory, mentorship, hostels with Wi-Fi facilities for resident students, expansive sports field, fully furnished gymnasium and spacious auditorium, well stocked library, free health check-up and medical facility, highly affordable cafeteria.

We have introduced NSS as an elective subject in our course curriculum. Our student volunteers from all four units regularly participate in NSS activities. Our College had received several State and University awards in the past years and I am confident it will do so in the coming ones as well.

As a part of our activities, we have adopted 47 children from backward communities living in the neighbouring Muradanga gram panchayat. Our volunteers act as their mentors and also help them with their studies. Recently we have helped two schools to set up water filtering and storage facilities with help from IIT Kharagpur.

Speaking of myself, I owe it to NSS for helping me to become a better person! During my student days at IIT Kharagpur I was a volunteer for the NSS programme there, and its activities later became my beloved area of work.

NSS in My Life

In the year 1982 I was admitted to the M.Sc. (Chemistry) programme at IIT Kharagpur as a student, after clearing the Joint Admission Test for M.Sc. (JAM).

Students at IIT were required to opt to join either NCC or NSS, and I chose the latter. Thus it was that I had my introduction to NSS. It was a credit course, which meant that it carried of weightage towards the total marks we would obtain in the semester.

The coordinator or person in overall charge of the course was Professor A.K. Saha. It was under his guidance and supervision that I first developed ideas about social responsibility. I was from a relatively well-off family, who had almost no connection with the toiling masses. At home I would see my mother stand beside the slum dwellers near our house in their hour of need. But I was never very curious about how the lower strata of society lived. I had only a vague idea about the world beyond my home.

NSS helped me to develop a clearer picture about the lives of the less well-off people of the society. Professor M.M. Godkhindi of the Metallurgical Engineering Department of IIT was our programme officer, and we worked under his direction. Twice every week we worked among the families of lowest level of employees of IIT -- cleaners, janitors and such -- who lived on the periphery of the IIT campus. This was quite far from the centre of the campus where classes for our other subjects were held. Not having learnt cycling then, I literally had to run to make it to the NSS class in time. I was tasked with teaching mathematics to the school students there. In between my duties, I would watch with amazement and admiration Professor Godkhindi pick up the little children in soiled clothing, sit them in his lap and play with them. We were all inspired by his sincerity and compassion.

One of my fellow NSS workers, a boy possibly from Maharashtra, studying in the Metallurgical Engineering Department, also mixed very freely with the young and old residents of the locality. Language seemed to be no barrier to him! I was much inspired by his attitude and work, and I developed an admiration and liking for him. When, at the end of our two year M.Sc. course we were all about to leave for home, he asked me to see him in the library. Due to hesitation born of shyness, I did not go. But his personality, his dedication and sensitivity still inspire me.

Later, in my professional life, I was able to renew my touch with NSS. While a teacher at Midnapore College, I was a programme officer for two terms. Here I faced hurdles in the form of insults, non-cooperation and such, but I did not give up. I believe that during my tenure the performance of my team of students was very good and we succeeded in making a positive difference to the lives of the slum dwellers living around Midnapore College. We worked in slums such as Hatar Math,

Saradapally and Lal Dighi. With help from the Ramakrishna Mission we got constructed toilets in many houses in Saradapally.

Once, our team conducted a 10-day camp at Gurguripal School. Dr. Sibaprasad Rout, an optometrist from Midnapore, was instrumental in conducting an eye camp there. The day before Camp Fire Night as I was racing to complete some work in the camp I had a nasty fall and badly fractured my ankle. Sadly, I had to leave camp and return home. To this day I suffer from the ill effects of that fall! By regularly visiting our adopted slums we developed, over time, a degree of closeness with the residents. They then talked freely with its about their needs and the problems they faced in daily life. From them we learnt about the problems people in the lower strata of society faced. Once Professor SwapanPramanik, then Vice Chancellor of Vidyasagar University, gave a talk at Midnapore College on NSS Day, 24th September. Inspired by his talk, volunteers from all seven NSS units of the College helped to build a road in the Saradapally slum, an effort which was much appreciated by the residents. This really enthused the volunteers. The National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) of the Ministry of Human Resource Development greatly appreciated the work done by the NSS units of the College when they visited to assess the performance of the College.

In January of the year 2000 I took 11 students to the National Integration (NI) Camp at Agartala, Tripura. There I got a clear picture about an NI camp. To me the Camp seemed to be a live demonstration of national integration!

I attended many camp in the capacity of programme officer. When Professor Anil Jana was the NSS programme coordinator at Vidyasagar University, he deputed me twice to attend camps at IIT Kharagpur on how to spread awareness about AIDS. In December 2004 he sent me to the Labour Institute in New Delhi to learn about child labour, it's prevalence and amelioration. I got the opportunity to interact with many programme coordinators from all over the country. I kept in touch with many of them for many years after the training programme was over. I remember well the experience of participating in a short play. My acting in it to explain the difference between 'apathy' and 'sympathy' was well appreciated. At that time my only son was a student of Class IX. On the morning of the last day of the programme the devastating tsunami of 2004 struck: it was the 26th of December. Participants from Kerala and Tamil Nadu were particularly worried about the safety of their loved ones.

When I joined this College as the Principal I started a NSS course here at the first opportunity. Then, under the auspices of NSS, our College 'adopted' 47 children from backward communities living in nearby villages and took the responsibility of meeting their educational expenses. My experience in the NSS has helped me to become a complete person. I believe every college student should compulsorily join the NSS for at least a year.

The National Service Scheme (NSS) is a public service programme steered by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports of Indian Government with the intension of developing students' personality by engaging them in voluntary public services. After our long-awaited Independence, University Grants Commission, led by SarvepalliRadhakrishnan recommended of introduction of voluntary national services in the educational institutions. In 1958, Jawaharlal Nehru's letter to the chief Ministers stressed social service as an integral part of students' life. Finally, NSS was launched bythe Indian Government in Gandhiji's Birth Centenary in 1969 as it was regarded as the brainchild of Mahatma Gandhi who wanted the students' engagement in social services. This programme had an intension to implant the idea of social well-being in students who would serve the society unconditionally and whole-heartedly and the volunteers would try to extend their helping hands to those who are in distress. Even they would try to help them who have become prey to the natural calamities. Our college internalised this thought and inspired the students to engage themselves in greater cause — to serve the society bringing their all-round development.

Our NSS unit has made our college proud by their numerous achievements. It was awarded the Best NSS award from Vidyasagar University on 16.12.2017. NSS Volunteer Miss Moumita Chakraborty participated in West Bengal State NSS Republic Camp 2020 in Kolkata from 06.01.2020 to 27.01.2020. NSS Volunteer Miss Papiya Das participated in National Integration camp in Lucknow from 12.01.2020 to 18.01.2020. NSS Volunteer Miss Zigeesha Mahato participated in East Zone Pre-Republic Day Camp 2020 from 22.11.2020 to 01.12.2020. NSS Volunteer Miss Sanchita Chakrabarti joined the PRE -RD CAMP 2021 organized by CIT (Central Institute of Technology), Kokrajarh, Assam. Three NSS Volunteers, Miss Papiya Mondal, Miss Priyanka Nayek, Miss Disha Pan participated in the National Integration Camp held in Jagannath Kishore College, Purulia from 16.12.2021 to

22.12.2021. We have successfully organized National Seminar on "Forest: Our Legacy, Diversity, Utilization and Conservation" and West Bengal Biodiversity Board sponsored National Seminar on "Ecology, Biodiversity and Health: Application Strategy" held on 15.02.2020 in collaboration with Nehru Yuba Kendra and Ramnagar College. NSS has recently become a Separate General and Generic course from 2016-2017 sessions. Nirmalya Kumar Sinha is currently working as the In-Charge of this subject. Sri Nirmalya Kumar Sinha, NSS Programme Officer, NSS Unit I of Raja Narendra Lal Khan Women's College (Autonomous) has been awarded with the Best NSS Porgramme Officer Award for the session 2019-2020 in the ceremony of the West Bengal State National Service Scheme Awards Function held on 7th January 2022 at Vivekananda Sabhagriha, R.K.M Vidyamandira, Belur Math, Howrah. With the strong belief that our role is not merely to impart education to our students in the classroom and in our continuous endeavour to serve the society and develop a strong connection with the underprivileged backward sections of the large number of adjacent rural population, our college has initiated unique outreach programme — "We Care", where we have adopted 46 tribal children of the nearby Muradanga Village. Report of NSS activities of the College of Agriculture (SKNAU) Lalsot, Dausa, Rajasthan

Report of NSS activities:

The College of Agriculture, Lalsot was established vide announcement in Budget Session 2007 (para 135), by Hon'ble Chief Minister of Rajasthan and subsequent order No. F. 4(18) Agriculture-3/2013 Govt. of Rajasthan. It came into existence on August 17, 2007 as a constituent college of Swami Keshwanand Rajasthan Agricultural University (SKRAU) Bikaner. It is one of the ICAR accredited constituent college of Sri Karan Narendra Agriculture University (SKNAU) Jobner. The campus is spread over an area of 51 hectares, which includes research farm, instructional cum demonstration farm with academic and administrative blocks, hostels and residential quarters. The undergraduate degree programme is running in the college since its inception i.e.2007.

NSS – The Role of Volunteers for Socio-Economic upliftment of the Community and Opportunities

NSS or National Service Scheme was established with the Objectives of Development of the Personality of Students/Youth through the Community Service. To make Gandhiji's dream into reality i.e. to reform our Country after 190 years of foreign rule and to make them acquaintance to the problems of the Nation, the Scheme was introduced in our Country in the year 1969, the birth Centenary year of Mahatma Gandhi. At the very beginning it was started with 4 lakhs of NSS Volunteers in 40 Universities in our country. At present, the total Volunteer Strength is more than 40 lakhs and covered as many as 300 Universities/+2 Councils. After that, 24th September is celebrated as the "NSS Day" in every year throughout the Country. After a long journey, in this year, the glorious Scheme completed its Golden Jubilee Year i.e. 50th Anniversary.

The name of NSS or National Service Scheme is very famous in our small State of Tripura. Being a Small State in the North-Eastern part of India, Tripura is surrounded by Bangladesh in 3 sides. The Scheme namely NSS was introduced in our State in the year 1976 with 600 NSS Volunteers and only in 6 Colleges. Since then NSS was extended and in 1995, it was introduced in the +2 Level.

At present, there are 375 Units in Tripura with the enrolment of 32600 NSS Volunteers in Tripura Central University, different General, Technical, Professional Colleges, H.S. Schools and Open NSS Unit

The main aim and objectives of the NSS is "Development of Personality of the Students/Youth through Community Service". Under the banner of NSS, the Students take part in the different Social Welfare and Awareness Activities, they are acquainted with the problems of the Society and their solutions. Thus, they become able to adjust themselves with the different situations and build up their personality.

The NSS Volunteers participate in the Multifarious types of activities conducted by the NSS Units throughout the year under Regular Activities and Special Camping Programme. Under Regular Activities, an NSS Volunteer participate in the Activities for 120 hours in 48 days in a year in an average two and half hours in a day. Under Special Camping Programme, the NSS Volunteers stays together in the Adopted Village/Slum of the NSS Unit for 7 days and take part in the different types of Community Welfare and Personality Developmental Activities.

Amongst these Multifarious types of activities, Blood Donation is one of the remarkable and Major Activities conducted by NSS in our Tripura State. In Tripura, today Blood Donation has become a movement which was started by NSS initially since 1998. First time, the NSS organised Mega Blood Donation Festival was held on 27/02/1999 in which total 283 units of Blood were collected in a single Day. Simce then, the popularity of Blood Donation has been increasing day by day. In the NSS organised Blood Donation Programme, the Blood Donation and Cultural Activities go on together for which it has become a Festival from Camp. Every year a great portion of Blood are being collected by the NSS Units trough organizing Voluntary Blood Donation Camps in the Campus as well as in the Community. NSS Volunteers have been donating Blood regularly for the sake of the patients in the different Blood Banks. Even NSS Volunteers are motivating, encouraging the Community People, Local Youth and also mobilizing them for Blood Donation. NSS Volunteers have a better contribution in Blood Donation in Tripura and even nowadays many Blood Donation Camps are organised by the different Organisation where ex-NSS Volunteers have been playing a vital role. The works of NSS Volunteers in the field of Blood Donation are remarkable and praiseworthy.

For Development of any Society or Nation, Education is the first and foremost without which none can develop or prosper. The NSS Volunteers have been earnestly doing the task to eradicate the term" illiteracy" from the Country. The NSS Volunteers set up Night School, Evening School, etc. to educate or to literate people who are still away from literacy. This is a tremendous work performed by the NSS Volunteers under the able and dynamic guidance of NSS Programme Officers.

NSS has been conducting different types of Awareness Activities, Social Welfare Activities, Cultural Activities throughout the year. The NSS Volunteers also respond to the call of the Nation during Natural Disaster like Flood, Earthquake, Drought and even in time of war against the other country. For the Victims of Gujrat Earthquake in 2001, Nepal Earthquake in 2015, Super Cyclone in Odissa in the year 1999, Devastating Flood in Uttarakhand in 2013, Kargil War in 1999 the Open NSS Volunteers collected relief and sent to the Prime Minister's National Disaster Relief Fund. Every year to mark the Armed Forces Flag Day, the NSS Volunteers contribute fund for the welfare of the Soldiers and their family members. Every year a large no. of sapplings are planted in the different parts of our State and in the entire Country also by the NSS Volunteers. Awareness Programmes on HIV/AIDS, Anti Dowry, Legal Issues, Abuse of Drugs, Bad effects of Plastic Bags and Polythene, Water Conservation, Disaster Mitigation, etc. are conducted regularly by the NSS units. By actively participating in these activities, the Society People are not only developed, the NSS Volunteers highly develop their personalities, gather a lot of experiences for their coming future. They also learn to face the problems on their ways and how to solve these to make their better future.

The outstanding NSS Volunteers also get the glorious and tremendous opportunity to be the member of the Indian Youth Delegation to the Foreign Countries and from our State a few NSS Volunteers including myself got this chance which is a matter of pride for all of us.

State Level NSS Festival conducted by the Tripura State NSS Cell is a unique in the entire Country and a great Opportunity for the NSS Volunteers to participate in such a wonderful event of NSS. In this year, 6th Tripura State Level NSS Festival is being organized with the participation of NSS Volunteers from the entire Tripura State. Mass Plantation, Rally, Cultural Performances, Felicitation, Conferring of State Level Best NSS Volunteers, NSS Programme Officers + NSS units Awards, Motivating & Awareness Sessions by the Great Personalities, etc. are the main attractions of the Festivals.

To motivate and encourage the NSS Volunteers, NSS Programme Officers + NSS Units, the State Level Best NSS Volunteers, NSS Programme Officers + NSS Units Awards are conferred by the Tripura State NSS Cell. By these, the NSS Volunteers, NSS Volunteers are highly motivated and the NSS Activities are also developed across the State.

For outstanding Performances, the NSS Volunteers, NSS Unit and NSS Programme Officers were recognized by the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, Govt. of India since 1993-94. Overview of the Midnapore Municipality

Midnapore (also written as Medinipur and Midnapur) is a town in West Bengal, India. The city is the headquarters of, and gives its name to, the PaschimMedinipur district of the state of West Bengal. The town also gives its name to a subdivision of the district. The town used to belong to the Midnapore District until the Partition of Midnapore. The Partition of Midnapore was the administrative breakup of the Midnapore District of West Bengal, India into the western part as Paschim Medinipur and the eastern part as Purba Medinipur districts that became effective on January 1, 2002. With the division of the district, the subdivisions of Medinipur Sadar, Kharagpur, Jhargram, and Ghatal were placed in Paschim Medinipur, with Midnapore, now the district headquarter of only the western half. The undivided Midnapore district had been, at one time, the largest district in West Bengal and indeed, all of India.





It is situated on the banks of the Kangsabati River (variously known as Kasai and Cossye). On the opposite bank of the river is the industrial and railway hub Kharagpur. The bank of Kangasabati River is great for sightseeing and fishing and a popular destination for picnics during the Christmas and New Year's breaks. Unfortunately, the bank is being eroded by new construction, brick-kilns and new communities.

Origin of the name

There are conflicting accounts of how the name Medinipur came to be. One account claims that Medinipur was named after a local deity "Medinimata" (literally "mother of the world", a Shakti incarnation). Another account claims that Midnapur was so named because in the heyday the number of mosques rivalled those in Medina.

Historical Overview

A number of prehistoric sites of great interest are being excavated throughout the West Midnapore district. In ancient times the region seems to be highly influenced by Jainism and Buddhism. Coins issued by Samudra Gupta have been found in the near vicinity of the town. The kingdom of Shashanka and Harshavardhana included what is now Midnapore.

Midnapore is famous for its contribution in the history of Indian freedom movement since it has produced a seemingly endless list of martyrs. During the British Raj the town became a centre of revolutionary activities starting from the Santal Revolt (1766-1767) and the Chuar Revolt (1799). The Zilla School, now known as Midnapur Collegiate School was the birthplace of many extremist activities. Teachers like Hemchandra Kanungo inspired and guided the pupils to participate in the Indian Freedom Movement. Three British District Magistrates were assassinated in succession by the revolutionaries BenoyBasu, Dinesh Gupta, and Badal Gupta. Dalhousie Square, a major location in Kolkata is named B.B.D. Bagh in their honour. Khudiram Bose and Satyendranath Basu were some of the young men that laid down their lives for the freedom of India. Kazi Nazrul Islam attended

political meetings in Midnapore in the 20s. Even Raja Narendra Lal Khan, ruler of Narajole, who donated his palace on the outskirts of town, for the establishment of Midnapore's first college for women, had been implicated, (although it turned out to be false) for planting a bomb. Huseyn Shaheed Suhrawardy founder of the Awami League, a prominent political party in Bangladesh, and the sixth President of Pakistan hailed from a prominent family of Midnapore.

Geography

Midnapore is 23 metres above sea-level. Soils near the Kangsabati River are alluvial with a high-degree of clay or sand depending on the locality; whereas soils towards Rangamati are essentially lateritic. Vegetation is essentially same of that common to South Bengal with extensive eucalyptus and sal forests on Northwest side of town. In fact, the sal forests form part of the Dalma Bengal-Jharkhand Range. Arabari, the forest range which was the site of India's first Joint Forest Management scheme is only 30 km away. The Midnapore town covers an area of 18.36 sq. kms. Surrounded by the Cassai river on the south, Panchkuni 1 and Panchkuni 2 G.P. on the west, Siromoni G.P. on the north and Kankabati G.P. on the east.

Demographics

As of 2011 India census, Medinipur had a population of 1,69,127 out of which male population is 85360 and female population is 83,767. This makes it the second largest town in Paschim Medinipur district after Kharagpur. The town is almost equally divided in terms of population between Hindus and Muslims. A witness to the diversity of faith is multiple mosques and temples, many predating British rule. It is an important religious spot for the Muslims of India and Bangladesh.
